Update From the Neighbourhood Planning Group

The Neighbourhood Development Plan work is progressing and we are moving towards the draft plan consultation stage. We are working hard to get to that point so that the community can see in full the proposals that we put forward and can comment on them. You may be aware that we have had to adjust the project timetable a bit as this task is taking longer than was originally anticipated as we've had to allow time to schedule meetings with other groups and organisations. By doing so we hope to be able to provide all of the information that we possibly can so that you can provide us with detailed thoughts and comments through the consultation.

You can find the revised timetable on the website (link below). For those not on the internet a printed copy will be added to the Neighbourhood Plan notice board (the cabinet next to the Buttercross) for information shortly.

We are currently seeking a meeting with Abbots Bromley School with regards to their intentions for the Anglesey/equestrian centre site off Radmore Lane. As you may be aware the school are running the equestrian facility through "AB Equine" at the current time but as far as we know they remain committed to develop the area for some housing over the longer term.

In September members of the Neighbourhood Plan group ran and supported the Abbots Bromley Sports Association reservoir 10K. Whilst by no means world beating in our running times we all managed to complete the race and it was a pleasure to support the community in this way.



We will update again when we know more but stay up to date by visiting the website and by keeping an eye on the notice boards. When the draft plan is ready for consultation we will ensure that we let everyone across the Parish know via a range of different methods as we will seek as much feedback as possible. HS2 – update November 2017




The High Speed Rail (West Midlands to Crewe) Hybrid Bill (Fradley to Crewe) had its first reading in Parliament on 17/07/17. The second reading of this bill has yet to be announced. Royal Assent is anticipated to be given in 2019. This would enable construction to start in 2020, with testing etc to take place in 2026, and the line opening in 2027.

The line opening has been brought forward by 6 years, from 2033.

Although the construction working day is still from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m (plus allowed travelling time), excluding Saturday afternoons and Sundays, so many caveats have now been added that it is possible we may experience 24/7 working.

Because we are more than 1.5 km from the line, HS2 have confirmed that neither the residents of our village, or the Parish Council, will automatically be included in any relevant correspondence re this project. But we will endeavour, despite the efforts of HS2, to keep you informed of any relevant developments.
